




Burros – Lake Pleasant Herd Management Area

- BLM manages protected wild burros in the 70,000-acre Lake Pleasant Herd Management
 Area west of and encompassing Lake Pleasant
- Wild burros are frequenting highways in the North and West Phoenix Valley, including State Route 74 (Carefree Highway West), the Loop 303, Lake Pleasant Highway, Interstate 17, New River Road, Castle Hot Springs Road, and numerous surface streets throughout the area.

- Coordinate incident responses and reporting




Sun Valley to Morgan Transmission Line

Planning began April 8, 2011, and has been ongoing.

- BLM approved the project and granted the right-of-way on 9 mi. of public land Jan. 17, 2014.
- Once BLM approves the Plan of Development, APS will begin construction in Fall 2016.
- The 500/230 kV transmission line will span 38 miles and connect APS's planned Sun Valley substation near the Town of Buckeye with the existing Morgan Substation in the City of Peoria.
- Nine National Register-eligible cultural resource sites are known to be within the ROW. All sites will be avoided where practicable.


Sun Valley to Morgan Transmission Line Map






<u>Sun Valley to Morgan Transmission Line Map – Detail</u>

Black Canyon National Recreation Trail

80-mile trail which stretches from Phoenix to within 40 miles of Prescott, and features hiking, mountain biking, and horse riding.

- 2008 Designated a National Recreation Trail.
- 2012 Bicycling Magazine ranked the Trail the best ride in Arizona.
- 2014 International Mountain Biking Association (IMBA) ranked it the best mountain biking trail in the Arizona.
- 2015 IMBA selected the Trail as one of the "Top 20 Mountain Bike Opportunities" in nation.
