For this event ONLY, the following items with fees charged will be:

- Water based paint: 1 gallon pails - \$3 ea; 5 gallon pails - \$15 ea.
- TV's: \$5 each for any size (CRT older tube type models).
- Paper shredder on site from 9am to 12pm. 3 boxes free.

For this event ONLY, the following will be accepted:

<i>MCSO, Sheriff's Office</i>	<i>NO QUESTIONS ASKED for drugs to be disposed of. (No needles or liquids.)</i>
<i>Goodwill of Central AZ</i>	<i>Donations of usable household products, clothing, kitchen supplies</i>



Transfer Station Regular Operating Rules & Fees

Accepted Items & Fees

Burning household trash is illegal. No burn barrels will be accepted.

Services are open to all Maricopa County residents; no I.D. is required at our Recycling Centers.

All Facilities are CASH ONLY. (We do not accept debit, credit cards, or checks).

When vehicle load is determined, this includes only the "cargo" area of a single vehicle or trailer.

Appliances & Large Items

All Appliances	\$8 / Item
CRTs	\$5 / item

We accept CFC (Freon) containing appliances, **however they must be** evacuated, compressor removed and tagged in accordance with EPA regulations prior to your visit for disposal. Documentation of that removal must be provided.

Accepted Recyclables

Recyclables are accepted with no charge (free) except where noted.

Aluminum / Aluminum Cans / Tin Cans

All forms of aluminum from window frames to soda cans are accepted. Aluminum cans, pie plates, and tin cans can be placed in comingled containers and need not be separated. All other forms of aluminum/metal is considered scrap metal and goes into our metal container.

Glass

Clear, Brown and Colors

All colors of jars and bottles accepted. **No broken glass or ceramics.**

Paper, Magazines, Newspaper, Cardboard

Shredded paper should be in a clear and tied plastic bag. Please keep your paper products dry.

Paper egg cartons are acceptable, as well as all colors of paper.

Plastics

Plastic bottles numbered 1-7 can be recycled at our centers. Empty, rinse and let air dry.

Plastic grocery bags are not accepted at our facilities. These can be recycled at your local grocery store (e.g. Target, Walmart, Frys, Bashas) or check <http://www.plasticbagrecycling.org>

Please keep the following items separate from all other recyclable material. These items have a separate container at our facilities.



Scrap Metal

Various metal items are accepted for free, however large appliances (Washer/Dryers, Stoves, Dishwashers, Water Heaters, Air Conditioners, Refrigerators and Freezers) are accepted for \$8.00 each. See appliances section above.

Tires

Passenger and Truck Tires - limit of 5 tires per visit. Must be removed from rim.

Certain Household Hazardous Waste

Batteries – **ONLY dry cell batteries** (household batteries i.e. AAA, AA, D, C, 9V). We do not take wet cell batteries (auto/marine/motorcycle).

Oil or Antifreeze - Up to 5 Gallons per visit

Items We Do Not Accept

The following is a list of several wastes that are unacceptable at the county's disposal facilities. This list is provided only as a guide to help our customers and should not be considered complete or exclusive of any other wastes that might be regulated or unacceptable for some other reason. Effective May 15, 2013, we have discontinued our Light Bulb Recycling Program. Stores such as Batteries Plus and ACE Hardware, or Home Depot or Lowe's will accept light bulbs for recycling.

Prohibited Wastes

- Polychlorinated biphenols (PCBs) or wastes mixed with PCBs
- Radioactive wastes
- Infectious wastes
- Commercial quantities of liquid wastes
- Friable asbestos-containing wastes
- Industrial wastes.
- Dead animals and animal parts will not be accepted.
- Bulk propane and Freon containers.



- Wet cell batteries (auto/marine/motorcycle)
- County residents may bring in five (5) tires per visit. No tires are accepted from commercial sources.
- Waste from shredding motor vehicles ([Special Waste](#))
- Waste that contains petroleum contaminated soils ([Special Waste](#))
- Containers of five gallons or larger must be open, empty or contain less than one inch of dried non-hazardous residue, and be rendered unusable

Green Waste and Composting

Residents can dispose of their yard waste at any of our six Recycling Centers. Waste Resources & Recycling has purchased a grinder to grind and process wood and green organics. Mulching green organics diverts these compostable materials from our landfill and is healthy for our environment. Benefits of this project include reduce erosion on landfill surfaces and provide a vegetative cover on barren land surfaces to be established. How you can help us divert green organics from our landfill.

Prior to your visit:

- Separate your green organic material (minus palm fronds and oleanders) from non-organic material.
- Separate the green organics from any food or garbage.
- If you're transporting green organics and garbage in the same trailer/vehicle, please keep the garbage in plastic bags to prevent contamination.

Once you arrive, notify the attendant that you have "clean green organics."

Used Oil

You can drop off your used oil at any of our six locations for free (5 gallons max) or check with local automobile maintenance facilities, automotive parts stores to see when and where you can drop off your used oil for recycling.



Waste Tire Recycling Program

The responsibility of our department is to ensure that all waste tires are recycled and/ or properly disposed of as outlined by the State of Arizona.

Another goal set forth by the department is to become a leader and model for other states and counties that are responsible for managing a Waste Tire Program. The Department seeks to provide education and information in all aspects of the Waste Tire Program.

Any individual or company that generates waste tires in Maricopa County and utilizes the Maricopa County Waste Tire Collection Site for proper disposal is required to register with us.

Are there any restrictions to the types of tires accepted at the collection sites?

Yes. Tires cannot be on rims, encased with dirt or other contaminants, and generated or collected from outside of Maricopa County.

Definitions

"Motor Vehicle" means any automobile, motorcycle, truck, trailer, semi trailer, truck tractor and semi-trailer, combination or other vehicle operated on the roads of this state, used to transport persons or property and propelled by power other than muscular power, but motor vehicle does not include traction engines, vehicles that run only on a track, bicycles or mopeds.

"Off road motor vehicle" (non-program) means any automobile, motorcycle, truck, trailer, semi-trailer, truck tractor and semi-trailer combination, heavy equipment used in mining or metallurgical operations, agriculture, construction or earth moving activities and propelled by power other than muscular power but off road motor vehicle does not include traction engines, vehicles that run only on a track, bicycles or mopeds.

"Waste tire" means a tire that is no longer suitable for its original intended purpose because of wear, damage or defect.
